



THE 2018 NEW MEXICO SCHOLASTIC CHESS CHAMPIONSHIPS

- **SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 17: 42ND ANNUAL NM GRADES K-12 CHAMPIONSHIP.** B. F. Young Professional Center, Santa Fe.
- **SATURDAY, MARCH 3: 39TH ANNUAL NM GRADES K-9 CHAMPIONSHIP.** New Mexico State University, Las Cruces
- **SUNDAY, April 8: 39TH ANNUAL NM GRADES K-6/K-3 CHAMPIONSHIP.** Wyndham Albuquerque Hotel and Conference Center.

TOURNAMENT SECTIONS

Each tournament is divided into multiple sections of different skill levels. Contestants play only opponents in their own section. The Championship section is the most competitive, while, e.g., the ratings Under 1200, and Under 700 sections are easier in that order.

All sections below Championship have ratings restrictions (see pg. 3). Unrated players may play in any section, subject to grade restrictions. A player is unrated if she/he has never played in a United States Chess Federation (USCF) rated tournament or has no rating on the USCF website.

HOW TO ENTER THE TOURNAMENTS

To enter one or more tournaments, see the entry details on page 4 of this flier. Payment must be paid online or mailed to Jeff Dunning as indicated on page 4. All entry fees and applicable USCF membership dues must be paid for registration to be accepted. School Purchase Orders (POs) are accepted.

Due to the large turnout at these events we require every player to register in advance. **Absolutely no entries are allowed after 6:00 PM two days before the tournament.** More information can be found at <http://nmsco.org/state-champs/>.

Please Note Deadlines: Entry fees will be assessed strictly according to the payment postmark or credit card submission. **Preliminary registration must be made on-line (no phone or fax entries), and payment must be received or postmarked by the corresponding deadline to complete registration; otherwise the student will be ineligible. Payment only via regular mail, hand delivery, or on-line at <http://nmsco.org/state-champs/>.**

***** Any player that has registered for an NMSCO tournament previously will receive an email with their username and password, sent to the address provided for that player. If you don't receive an email and you have forgotten a player's username/password, e-mail nmchess@comcast.net.**

The entry fee is \$18 per player if postmarked or paid online **2 weeks** before the tournament; and \$25 thereafter until 6 PM two days before the tournament (see page 4).

FINANCIAL AID

No New Mexico player will be denied entry into the state championships for lack of funds. For financial aid, contact Jeff Dunning before submitting payment.

Requesting a Half Point Bye: Any player with an activity conflict may request a half point bye in any single round of any tournament at any time prior to 8:30 AM (K-6/K-3 9:00 AM) on the day of the tournament.

WITHDRAWING FROM A TOURNAMENT

A player who wishes to withdraw with a full refund must either contact Jeff Dunning at (505) 670-3057 or withdraw in the tournament directors' room prior to 8:30 AM (K-6/K-3 9:00 AM) on the day of the tournament. Also, please send an email to Jeff Dunning at nmchess@comcast.net to request the refund.

TEAM SCORE

There is no limit to how many players a school can enter into a tournament. A school's team score in any section is calculated by adding the scores of the school's top four scoring players. To score points for their school, players must be full time students at the school. Home-schooled teams must send a team roster to Jeff Dunning. Club teams are allowed in all sections except Championship or Reserve sections and must notify Jeff Dunning of their intent to play as a single team. Club teams are not eligible to win State Scholastic Championship Sections per USCF and NMSCO rules. Submit the roster or intent by one week prior to the regular registration deadline. Admission of such teams is subject to the approval of Martin Cooper or the organizing committee. A school must have at least two players in a section to qualify for a team trophy, except as noted next. So that inexperienced players are not forced into the K-6/K-3 and K-9 Championship Sections to complete a team, there is a special provision that allows a school to borrow up to two handicapped scores from the Reserve and apply them to the Championship section. (The tournament scorekeepers automatically carry out this procedure.)

INDIVIDUAL AND TEAM AWARDS

Each state champion or co-champion will receive a championship plaque. Any player who finishes among the top three of a section will receive a trophy (sections with only K-6) or medals. The top three teams in each section will receive trophies except for the K-12 championship section. Honorable mention trophies or medals will be awarded in each section for positive or even scores at the chief TD's discretion.

PAIRINGS AND RATINGS

Each player will be paired according to the USCF's Swiss pairing rules. A player is never eliminated due to a loss. Although players from the same school/club will not usually play one another, USCF rules may occasionally require such pairings. Pairings will utilize the ratings from the USCF website as they appear one week prior to the tournament. Players will automatically be moved up a section if dictated by a rating change since registering; however, moving down a section must be requested.

USCF MEMBERSHIP AND ID

Players must be current members of USCF. (Exception: anyone playing only in K-3 section in the K-6/K-3 tourney is not required to join.) Dues may be submitted with the entry payment, or you can register/renew at <https://secure.uschess.org/webstore/member.php>.

Membership categories/prices through NMSCO are:

Scholastic Member: \$16 per year for players age 12 and under; (\$24 with 6 issues per year of *Chess Life for Kids*).

Youth Member: \$21 per year, for players age 15 and under; (\$29 with 6 issues per year of *Chess Life*).

Young Adult Member: \$25 per year for players 24 years and under; (\$34 with 12 issues per year of *Chess Life*).

If the player has played in a USCF rated event before, the player's USCF 8-digit ID number and membership expiration date is necessary for on-line registration. Updated information can be obtained from the USCF website: <http://www.uschess.org/msa/MbrLst.php> by typing in the last and first name of your member.

Players who have never participated in a USCF rated event should enter their rating as UNR. Players who do not have a USCF ID should indicate the ID number as NONE and must include full dues unless playing only in a K-3 section in the K-6/K-3 tournament. If you register yourself on USCF website, you will immediately be given ID number, which you can use for registration.

AT THE TOURNAMENT

Players must report to the tournament by 8:50 AM (K-6/K-3 9:20 AM). Players who are not present at that time are not guaranteed a pairing for the first round or admittance to the tournament. The K-12 tournament should end at ~6 PM, the K-9 at ~5 PM and K-6/K-3 at ~4 PM; although the championship sections can run longer. If you must leave the tournament early, PLEASE notify the tournament directors before you do so, or you will leave a child sitting alone for 30 minutes without a game

Food may not be available at all tournaments, so players should either bring lunch or plan to buy it off site. Each player should bring a pen or pencil and, if possible, a set and clock. The organizers do not provide sets or clocks at these events. Sets and clocks may be offered for sale. A

chess clock must be used if available. Chess notation in some form is required of all players in grades 4 or higher.

TRAVEL DIRECTIONS

GRADES K-12 CHAMPIONSHIP (February 17, 2018) at B. F. Young Professional Building, 1300 Camino Sierra Vista, Santa Fe: The site is five blocks west of St. Francis Drive (U.S. 84/285), i.e. a right turn headed southbound and a left turn if headed northbound. Camino Sierra Vista is two blocks north of Cerrillos Road on St. Francis Drive. *Please use the rear parking lot.*

GRADES K-9 CHAMPIONSHIP (March 3, 2018) in the Education Department of New Mexico State University, O'Donnell Hall, 1220 Stewart Street, Las Cruces: Going southbound on I25 in Las Cruces, exit onto University Boulevard westbound. After 1 mile, turn left (South) onto Espina Street. After 0.3 miles, turn left (East) onto Stewart Street. After 0.1 miles, O'Donnell Hall will be on your right with parking to the East.

GRADES K-6/K-3 CHAMPIONSHIP (April 1, 2018) at the Wyndham Albuquerque Hotel and Conference Center, 2500 Carlisle Boulevard NE, Albuquerque: Take I-40 to exit 160 and go north on Carlisle Blvd. The hotel is immediately on your right.

GRADES K-12 CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP

February 17, 2018 – B. F. Young Professional Building, Santa Fe (start time 8:50 AM)

K-12 Championship

Phase 1

Open to all, 3 rounds, time limit G/85+5d. Only NM players are eligible for 2018 NM championship playoff and Denker spot. Recommended for strong players with at least two years of tournament experience.

U1200

Open only to players rated below USCF 1200 or unrated, 5 rounds, time limit G/40+5d. Recommended for intermediate strength players with some tournament experience.

U700 K-6

Open only to players in grades K-6 rated below 700 or unrated, 5 rounds, time limit G/40+5d. Recommended for new, younger players with little/no tournament experience.

GRADES K-9 CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP

March 3, 2018 – New Mexico State University, Las Cruces (start time 8:50 AM)

K-9 Championship

Open to all, 4 rounds, time limit G/70+5d. Top NM player and NM team = 2018 NM champions. Recommended for strong players with at least two years of tournament experience.

Reserve U1000

Open only to players rated below USCF 1000 or unrated, 5 rounds, time limit G/35+5d. Recommended for intermediate strength players with some tournament experience.

U500 K-6

Open only to players in grades K-6 rated below 500 or unrated, 5 rounds, time limit G/35+5d. Recommended for new players with little/no tournament experience.

GRADES K-6/K-3 CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP

April 8, 2018 – Wyndham Albuquerque Hotel and Conference Center (start time 9:20 AM)

K-6 Championship

Open to all K-6 players, 4 rounds, time limit G/55+5d. Top NM player and NM team = 2018 NM champions. Recommended for strong players in grades 4-6 with at least two years of tournament experience.

Reserve U950

Open only to K-6 players rated below USCF 950 or unrated, 5 rounds, time limit G/30+5d. Recommended for intermediate strength players in grades 4-6 with some tournament experience.

U600 K-6

Open only to players in grades K-6 rated below USCF 600 or unrated, 5 rounds, time limit G/30+5d. Recommended for newer players in grades 4-6 with little/no tournament experience.

K-3 Championship

Open to all in grades K-3, 5 rounds, time limit G/30+5d. Top NM player and NM team = 2018 NM champions. Recommended for stronger players with at least one year of tournament experience.

U600 K-3

Open only to players in grades K-3 rated below USCF 600 or unrated in grades K-3, 5 rounds, time limit G/30+5d. Recommended for players with little/no tournament experience.

NOTE:

USCF dues are not required for players registering only for Primary Championship, U600 K-3, or U400 K-2.

If the player does not have USCF membership or membership will have expired by the last tournament that she/he is signing up for, then include the appropriate dues for your chess player (unless you prefer to do this yourself at the USCF website). See Page 2 for the dues for various age cut-offs and magazine options (your minimum dues payment, with a \$1 NMSCO instant rebate, will be indicated on the final page of your online registration).

To participate in a tournament (except for K-3 sections), a player must either 1) have current USCF membership by the payment deadline (as verified by the USCF web-site), 2) have proof of recent payment, or 3) include the necessary dues payment with their registration payment.
